Artist's Statement

Things - solidinanimate objects - seem to be the most knowable, reliable and defined entities of our daily experience. I havealways suspected that this is not the entire truth. As a sculptor I explore the inner potential of things and create works that make the mystery, uneasiness and animate presence of solidobjects more apparent. The possibility of articulating ideas, feeling and questions without language is the aspect of sculpture I find most compelling.

These pieceswere made with the knowledge of many other related objects in mind. Althoughthey have no other utility than their accessibility to contemplation, their vocabularyis derived from the features of utilitarian objects. Form and function are confounded, mutated and hybridized to illuminate the richness and complexity of their being and of our experience of this world dense with things.
